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A HISTORY

Chaz was born in South Carolina on November 7, 1986. He played in three Indie Rock bands during his High School years: The Taxi Chaps, The Heist, and The Accomplice. His aforementioned graphic design degree was obtained at the University of South Carolina in 2009. During that same year he signed onto Carpark Records. Since then he's put out a considerable amount of music: three full albums, two EPs, a handful of singles, and numerous collaborations and remixes for other artists. He makes even more music

under another name, Les Sins. Chaz has been involved in planning and curating shows and music festivals too. It's no wonder he hasn't had time to pursue other interests,

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THE GENRE

oro y Moi's music has changed since the first album Chaz put out. He maintains various aliases to produce music in different genres. The Toro y Moi name is synonomous with experimental electronic beats overlaid with dream-like indie vocals. Some have dubbed the genre "chillwave" others, "electronic-indie-space-funk-glitch-hop." Chaz identifies his own music, especially his latest album Anything In Return, as electronic pop. However you classify it, you can definitely hear a heavy 80s and 90s vibe from most of his tracks. Even the production values mimic old stereos, cassette tapes, and vinyl.

For many, labeling music that tries to stand out as pop is a negative thing. But it isn't for Chaz. He says, "I've always taken the word 'pop' as its literal translation - it's accessible, and that's why it's popu-

lar. For a while, the attitude was "radio sucks," but pop isn't shunned anymore."

THE PROCESS

In Pitchfork's interview with Toro y Moi, he explained his mentality when he makes music. He outlined the tools he uses to produce. "I've seen artists turn into characters, and I don't want to become the "pop music guy." Pop music is awesome, but I like to keep changing it up. Electronic music is so weird because trends change so fast. I don't want to make something that sounds like Causers of This again. But I'm not worried about repeating myself-- I'm more worried that I'd just get bored. I like to challenge myself, to see if I can actually write a pop album that people can connect with lyrically. Musically, it's very accessible-- or, at least, I hope so."

Chaz describes his original musical process, how he started making music in his bedroom. "I was heavily influenced by my parents record collection and one thing that most suburban homes have—MTV (but of course, it was a different type of channel then). Creative power is born once you feed it—so not necessarily boredom, more like wondering thoughts."
